

Bruce H. Clark (KQ4JSN) became a silent Key on July 19th, 2024 at 12:27 a.m., after a brief battle with cancer.

Born on August 14th, 1948 in San Juan, Puerto Rico, Bruce was a distinguished veteran of the United States Armed Forces, having served in both the Army as a MP and the Air Force as an Electronics Tech

He retired from the Air Force with over 21 years of active duty service. Bruce also retired after 20 years from the USPS as a mail carrier. Outside of his passion for Amateur radio, GMRS radio, and CB radio.

Bruce was also a Nationally ranked Billiards player competing in Local and National tournaments. Bruce was laid to rest beside his wife of 51 years at the Palm Beach National Chapel in Lake Worth, Florida on July 25th, 2024.

From the Wayback Machine



What's a Florida Ham to do in the summer when lightning is flying and we have to disconnect our antenna systems for safety?

W1AW

There is a good news alternative. We can use our radio time to hone our skills. For example, if you have wanted to learn, or to improve your CW skill, the ARRL W1AW code practice transmissions are available in real time via ECHOLINK.

Install ECHOLINK on your computer, set up your ECHOLINK account, check the W1AW practice code schedule and you are ready to rock and roll.

W1AWBDCT

On your computer use the ECHOLINK software to join the "W1AWBDCT" Conference. At the designated times the dits and dahs will flow from your computer's speakers/headset. The ARRL also sends its daily bulletins via digital modes using the ECHOLINK Conference each day at 2200z (1800 local.)

PSK31

This provides an opportunity to hone digital skills, e.g. PSK31. Of course you have to set FLDI-GI, or similar programs, to capture the sounds going to your speakers. This is any easy configuration using the sound card setting in the digital programs.

An alternative would be to log onto the ARRL.ORG website and use the prerecorded mp3 recordings of code practice sessions, choosing the file at the WPM speed with which you are comfortable.

CWCOM

There is another alternative which provides the opportunity to engage in a live CW QSO over the internet. The program is called CWCOM. The is a free download from http://www.mrx.com.au/d_cwcom.htm. This web page not only includes the software download, but also helpful information to get you started. The trickiest part is attaching you key or paddle to the computer, but the site explains how to accomplish that task. Also, I found that with WINDOWS 10 I have to run the program as Administrator for it to work properly, as it was written for Windows 7. The hams on CWCOM are extremely helpful in configuring the software and SLOWING (QRS) to accommodate a newbie like me. It is not nearly as intimidating as sending CW over the airwaves.

Have a good time honing your skills, even in the heat of the Florida Summer. Also, do not forget the 100 QSO SHARC repeater contest. Join me in working toward your certificate! 73 I will be clear for now and will see you down the log, in the next chapter of this blog and/or at a meeting.
