Also as discussed at the March meeting we will be putting the repeater in auto format mode the week of March 26th. That mode will allow the use of the repeater for both analog and the Yaesu Fusion digital format. It may mean you will hear a data sound when its active if you are listening in Analog. We will monitor the formats use and evaluate if the mode is disruptive to normal repeater analog users. Please let us know your feelings. I am still working on a solution for the 443.800 repeater. I brought it back to my shop and have had it in test mode in a hope to install it in the coming weeks. If anyone wants to be added to the repeater committee please contact Larry Oaks W95X."



W95X

The Monday rag chew and tech net continues to develop with some new check in over the last few weeks. On March 11 we had 7 check ins which included Sal N2 UOG, Craig N8VIU, Wayne K4WEB, Tom WA2UCH Gene WB2NIE. There was discussion about 10 meter DX and logging. We also discussed the upcoming Solar Eclipse. A discussion concerning older vintage rigs was part of the discussion. We also had a small swap shop which we plan on including in the net in the future. On March 18 we had at least 10 check ins. A lot of discussion concerning several of the members projects. Larry W95X discused his current tower project. A 25 foot tall Rohn 25 with Yaesu AS/EL mount and 4 loop 55 element 1.2 gig antennas along with 4 55 element 2.304 GHZ antennas for Moon bounce. The array should be operational with a digital Q65 signal running several hundred watts focused on the moon by the end of the month. More to come on his project in the months and weeks ahead.

March Fox hunt

The March fox hunt happened on March 15 at Crews lake park as planned. We had three fox hunter in attendance but even with the small numbers we they all enjoyed the morning walk in the Park. The winner was Earl Brannon K4EEB using a three element tape measure beam. Mike Hayes W1SOX was at the loca-



tion early (within a few feet) but did not see the exact spot of the small transmitter. He was using a TOA antenna which takes a few times to understand its use. He's getting the hang of it. The transmitter was placed between two trash cans which hindered its view. Earl was affected by some reflections but he is making strong progress in understanding his equipment. A second hunt was done to hone both hunter's skills. The next fox hunt will be April 19th at Crews lake. K4EEB will be the FOX! Let us know if you need help with equipment.

Logging Software can really make the tedium of record keeping so easy. I had been using a local repeater dashboard, when the admins retired it.


